Dear Dr. Schlottfeldt: May I acknowledge your letter of December 10 to Dr. Miller with the information regarding the two candidates your Local Committee wishes to nominate for scholarships to the Mexican Agricultural Program. When all of the information on the application forms, which Dr. Watson will forward to you, and when the results of the medical examination are before us, we shall present these documents to our Committee in New York with the recommendation that action be taken promptly in order that these young agronomos may be able to start their period of training as early as possible in 1955, provided their qualifications have been found to be satisfactory.
